Role of an Ordinary Board Member

An **Ordinary Board Member** of the Irish Amateur Wrestling Association plays an important part in the collective governance of the Association. Ordinary Members do not hold specific officer positions (such as Chairperson, Secretary, or Treasurer) but share equal responsibility with the rest of the Board for ensuring the effective management, strategic direction, and compliance of the Association.

Key Responsibilities:

- Attend and actively participate in Board meetings, discussions, and decisionmaking.
- Contribute to the development and implementation of the Association's strategy, policies, and plans.
- Represent the interests of members and the wider wrestling community in Ireland.
- Support and promote the values, mission, and objectives of the IAWA.
- Monitor and review the performance of the Association and its activities.
- Ensure that the Association complies with legal, regulatory, and governance requirements.
- Take on tasks or roles as delegated by the Board or Chairperson (e.g., working groups, event support, policy input).
- Act in the best interests of the Association at all times, avoiding conflicts of interest.

Commitment:

Ordinary Board Members are expected to commit sufficient time to attend Board meetings, contribute to discussions, and engage with relevant activities, ensuring they are informed and effective in their role.
